**The 41st Japanese Language Speech
Contest**

Australian National Final on Saturday 16th October 2010 Guidelines

1. CONTEST BACKGROUND

This year will be the 41st year that the national speech contest has been held. The aim of the contest is to encourage learners who are studying Japanese to showcase their language skills in a challenging context.

2. CONTEST FORMAT

Winners from the state/territory contests from the following divisions will progress to the National Final. Individuals are not eligible to apply.

Divisions:

The National Final Contest has four categories. These are:

1. High School Senior Division
2. Open Beginner Division
3. Open Division
4. Background Speaker Division

Subject of Speech:

The subject, content and form of the speeches are left open to each contestant. Entrants who have competed in previous contests may not use the same speech (this includes title and content) presented in previous years.

Length of Speech (Time Limit):

High School Senior Division:	2.5 - 3 minutes
Open Beginner Division:	2.5 - 3 minutes
Open Division:	4.5 - 5 minutes
Background Speaker Division	4.5 - 5 minutes

3. ELIGIBILITY

High School Senior Division

This Division is open to students in Year 11 and 12. Contestants must fulfil all the following conditions to be eligible for the High School Senior Division:

- Contestant's background language is not Japanese
- Contestant may be studying Japanese as a Language other than English (LOTE)
- Contestant has not spent more than 2 years in Japan after the age of 6



- ◊ Contestant has not completed more than 2 years of Japan's compulsory education, either in Japan or at any Japanese school overseas
- ◊ Contestant has not been the first prize winner of a previous Australian National Final Contest in this division

Open Beginner Division

This Division has been created specially for beginner students of Japanese, and is open to individuals aged 17 or above, who are no longer high school students. Contestants must fulfil all the following conditions to be eligible for the Open Beginner Division:

- ◊ Contestant's background language is not Japanese
- ◊ Contestant may be studying Japanese as a Language other than English (LOTE) at a tertiary institution or privately
- ◊ Contestant has not completed more than 300 hours of formal Japanese study. However, if you think that your level is above beginner, we encourage you to apply for the Open Division
- ◊ Contestant has not spent more than 12 months in Japan after the age of 6
- ◊ Contestant has not completed more than 1 year of Japan's compulsory education, either in Japan or at any Japanese school overseas
- ◊ Contestant has not been the first prize winner of a previous Australian National Final Contest in this division

Open Division

This Division is open to individuals' aged 17 or above who are no longer high school students. Contestants must fulfil all the following conditions to be eligible for the Open Division:

- ◊ Contestant's background language is not Japanese
- ◊ Contestant may be studying Japanese as a Language other than English (LOTE) at a tertiary institution or privately
- ◊ Contestant has not spent more than 3 years in Japan after the age of 6
- ◊ Contestant has not completed more than 2 years of Japan's compulsory education, either in Japan or at any Japanese school overseas
- ◊ Contestant has not been the first prize winner of a previous Australian National Final Contest in this division

Background Speaker Division

This Division is open to contestants who are students in Year 11 and 12, and to individuals' aged 17 or above. Contestants must fulfil all the following conditions to be eligible for the Background Speaker Division:

- ◊ Contestant's mother and/or father's first language is Japanese
- ◊ Contestant may be studying Japanese as a Language other than English (LOTE) at a school, tertiary institution or privately
- ◊ Contestant has not spent more than 2 years in Japan after the age of 6
- ◊ Contestant has not completed more than 2 years of Japan's compulsory education either in Japan or at any Japanese school overseas
- ◊ Contestant has not been the first prize winner of a previous Australian National Final Contest in this division



4. JUDGING CRITERIA & JUDGES

The marking system is as follows:

High School Senior, Open Beginner and Open Divisions

Presentation	30% (e.g. delivery, manner, memorisation, attitude, impact, length)
Content	40% (e.g. coherence, cohesion of ideas, originality, intention, message)
Language	30% (e.g. fluency, pronunciation, grammatical complexity/flexibility, range of language, accuracy)

Background Speaker Division

Presentation and Language	50%
Content	50%

- ⦿ The speech must be the original work of the contestant. The degree of assistance given by teachers or by Japanese native speakers should be limited to no more than correcting grammatical errors or making minor alteration for the sake of continuity
- ⦿ Props (e.g. puppets, objects etc.) must not be used. A lectern will be provided for contestants to stand behind and on which to rest their notes. Use of the lectern is optional
- ⦿ Microphone with a stand will be provided for contestants.
- ⦿ Contestants should not read their speeches. Contestants may refer to their notes, however excessive consultation will result in marks being deducted
- ⦿ Uniform is not compulsory, however neat presentation is encouraged
- ⦿ Please be mindful of the speech time limit

Judges will be from the field of Japanese language education and members of the Japanese community, and will decide the winners. Aggregates of marks from all judges will determine the place allocated to each contestant in the order of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. In case of a draw, the judges will determine the outcome through discussion. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The content of the judges' discussion is not open to the public at any time.

5. PRIZES

All contestants will receive a participation certificate. Prizes will be awarded in each division.

6. DATE AND VENUE

The 41st Australian National Final Japanese Language Speech Contest is scheduled to take place at the Japan Foundation, Sydney on **Saturday, 16th October 2010**.

The Japan Foundation Sydney will provide transport (i.e. airfare) and accommodation for successful candidate(s) who are travelling from interstate.

Contestants must submit their speech summary in 100-150 words in English with their application form. This is used for the Contest Program on the day of the contest.
